

The workshop was extremely well organised with a good balance of briefing communications, site visits and design activity. I think the actual interaction with the communities living in the area selected for the workshop, was the most valuable component of this learning experience. Participants were first presented the area off-site with an overview of the characteristics and qualities of the suburb as well as its issues. Participants then had the opportunity to listen directly from people living in the community about their environment, their everyday issues, challenges, needs and desires. This structure was indeed really valuable and helped participants to gain a deep understanding of the area in a short time. The fact the working groups were mixed in terms of origin of members and especially disciplinary background was also really valuable. The different members have been able to bring to the discussion different perspectives. This was evident in the final presentations; ideas suggested by participants were well articulated and showcase a balance between top-down approaches and a willingness to accommodate the actual needs expressed by the community. Overall the workshop was effective in providing participants a well structure learning experience grounded in a real-world context.

国際性ということの本質は英語によるコミュニケーション能力にあるのではなく、変化や多様な文化を迎え入れる思考態度に宿るものです。タマサート大学 UDDI プログラムにおける国際的な精神を育む教育は、都市に対する権利をもつ市民グループのメリットのみを考えるアーバンデザイナーではなく、都市の課題に総合的に取り組むアーバンデザイナーの育成を考えたものです。

The true essence of being international is not about the ability of communicating in English. Being international is the mindset that welcomes change and diversified cultures. The process of planting the international mindset to the urban design and development program is therefore not about training the future urban designers to serve the only group of citizens with the exclusive rights to the city but rather to train the urban designers toward the inclusiveness of the urban solutions.

Creative Community Development Workshop 2017 for the communities in Bang Kho Laem district, Bangkok practically killed two birds with one stone. We are working with the underutilized local communities under the threats of being affected by the rapid urban real estate development together with the international students and professors from Japan, South Korea and Malaysia. The inclusiveness of urban solution covers a wide range of ideas and cultural integration.

持続可能な都市づくりのための国際アカデミックコンソーシアム (IACSC) は、学術機関やそれらが立地する都市間の協力関係を深化させ、持続可能な都市づくりに貢献することを目的に 2009 年に創設された学術ネットワークです。国際機関等の支援を受けながら、アジアを中心とした都市の大学研究者・学生等が相互に連携し、情報やリソースの共有、議論、調査、研究、プロジェクトを実施します。都市の諸問題の解決に取り組み、地域や世界に貢献することを目標とし、「まちづくり」「環境」「公衆衛生」の3つのテーマで活動を展開しています。

まちづくりユニットでは、2010年より国際シンポジウムや学生ワークショップの開催を通して、アジアの大学との交流を進めています。

創造的なまちづくり

バンコク都市部におけるコミュニティ活性化のための提案

はじめに

地域が直面する課題を発見し、その背景や意味、構造を理解し、解決策を提示・実行する「まちづくり」活動には、さまざまな能力が求められます。一方、世界には社会的背景の違いからさまざまなまちづくりの様相がみられます。社会状況、文化、思想などが異なる海外におけるまちづくりを海外の学生とともに体験することは、それ自体が貴重な経験であると同時に、思い込みを排して世界を相対化し、まちづくり活動を客観的・積極的に進めるための能力の土台形成、また文化・言語等の障壁を越えられるコミュニケーション能力の涵養につながるものです。このような視点から、IACSC まちづくりユニットでは、アジアの学生と交流しながら、その地域が抱える課題に取り組むワークショップを毎年、実施してきました。

今年度のワークショップは、タイ・バンコク市中心部の南側に位置するバン・コー・レーム地区内のスアン・ヤイ・バン・クワン地区を対象地とし、タマサート大学(タイ)、仁川国立大学(韓国)、マレーシア科学大学(マレーシア)、横浜市立大学(日本)の4つの大学の参加を得て実施しました。全体テーマは「創造的なまちづくり」です。全59名の学生は10グループに分かれ、「住宅」「環境」「商店街活性化」「防災」「地域経済活性化」「コミュニティの発展」「移動性とアクセス性」「運河を活かした地域活性化」の個別テーマに焦点を当ててグループワークを進めました。フィールドワークとディスカッションを通して、学生たちが練り上げ、作り上げた各グループ25枚のアイディア・カードは、対象地をより魅力的で住みやすく、持続的なまちにするための提案です。

Introduction

Diverse abilities are required for the urban planning that identifies issues that local communities are facing with, understands the meaning of those issues, and proposes and implements solutions for them. Reflecting differences of socio-cultural contexts worldwide, the approach of urban planning itself is also diverse. Experiencing international urban planning workshop in a foreign country of different social contexts and culture must be an irreplaceable asset for the students. At the same time, it will lead to build basic ability to proceed subjectively and proactively the urban planning without any prejudice. It also nurtures communication abilities beyond cultural and linguistic differences. Having these viewpoints, the Urban Planning Unit of the IACSC, coordinating with several universities in Asia has continuously held annual workshops to think about solutions for local urban problems.

The workshop's main focus this year is to consider community regeneration in the city facing the rapid urbanization, picking up Suan Yai Bang Khwang in Bang Kho Laem district in Bangkok metropolitan area as the study site. A total of 59 students from Japan, Malaysia, South Korea and Thailand were divided into 10 groups. Each group was assigned a specific theme; housing development, environmental development, commercial revitalization, disaster prevention, local economy development, community development scheme, improvement of mobility and accessibility, and the revitalization based on the canal. Each group created a set of 25 idea cards as the result of the site visits and in-depth discussion to present a proposal to make the study site more attractive, livable and sustainable.

対象地区バン・コー・レーム地区内 スアン・ヤイ・バン・クワン地区

バン・コー・レーム地区はバンコク中心部の南側にチャオプラヤ川とチャルンクルン通りに沿って広がる地域である。かつては、チャオプラヤ川から引いた運河を灌漑に利用する肥沃な農地であったが、川を通じた交易が盛んであったバンコクにおいて、19世紀以降、多様な民族集団を移民として受け入れながら、ウォーターフロント地域が開発されていった。

1960年代から1970年代にかけては都市住宅が徐々に広がり、今日では、きわめて人口密度の高い地域となっている。しかし、バン・コー・レーム地区の中でも、スアン・ヤイ・バン・クワン地区では大規模開発がこれまで行われてこなかったことから、細い路地や運河を含め、オリジナルの都市構造が現在まで残されている。運河は一部、歩行者や自転車の通行スペースを創出するために暗渠化され、もともとの幅の半分程度になっているところもあるものの、車両が通行できる通りはいまだ一本のみである。建物の容積率は700%まで認められてはいるが、高層ビルの進出はまだみられない。一方、開発の波は間近まで押し寄せており、2012年にはチャルンクルン通りを挟んだ川沿いに商業施設であるアジアティーク・リバーフロントが開業し、多くの観光客を集めている。これまでとは性質の異なる大型の経済活動、そして、ウォーターフロント地区における大規模開発が、スアン・ヤイ・バン・クワン地区と隣り合っている。

Bang Kho Laem district along the Chao Phraya River and Charoen Krung Road locates at the south of the center of Bangkok. It used to be the fertile agricultural land with irrigation canals stretched from the Chao Phraya River, and from 19th century experienced the waterfront development accepting immigrants of different ethnic groups. In the 1960s-1970s, the urban housing was increasingly spreading in the district, and nowadays the area is so densely populated. Since within Bang Kho Laem district, Suan Yi Bang Khwang area has not experienced the large scale development so far, the original urban fabric including narrow alleys and canals still remains and the only one street is open to the car traffic although some parts of canals have become almost half the width of the original after having been covered to provide more spaces to pedestrians and bikes. High-rise buildings also have not come in yet in spite of its high FAR (Floor Area Ratio) 700%. The resent largest change surrounding the area was the opening of Asiatique in 2012 across the Charoen Krung Road. The big economy and the risk of high-rise waterfront development have been creeping up.



Introduction, country report and lecture

タマサート大学建築都市計画学部長、および都市デザイン・発展国際プログラム顧問より歓迎あいさつをうけた後、韓国、マレーシア、日本の学生が、各大学が所在する都市と各都市における地域活性化やまちづくりの事例についてプレゼンテーションを行いました。国別の報告の後は、バンコク都心部におけるまちづくりを検討していくうえでの基礎情報としてバンコクにおける都市再生について、またワークショップ対象地の概要と基礎データについて、タマサート大学のヨングタニット・ピモンサティエン准教授より講義をうけました。最後に学生全員が自己紹介を行い、緊張の面持ちで1週間のワークショップが始動しました。

On the first day, after welcoming remarks by the Dean of APTU, and the founder/advisor of the UDDI, each university of INU, USM and YCU made a presentation about their home city and a couple of cases of community development projects therein. After three country reports, the students were given a lecture on urban regeneration in Bangkok and the study site by Associate Professor Yongtanit Pimonsathean, UDDI-APTU, through which they got basic information to consider the district planning in urban area in Bangkok, and information on statistical data, history, and the present situation of the site. The self-introduction of all the students followed the lecture, and then one week workshop was kicked off.











Sep 5&6

2日目も対象地区において終日、グループごとにフィールドワークを行いました。グループそれぞれが $1\sim2$ つのコミュニティを担当し、コミュニティリーダーへのインタビューや担当地区内踏査を通して、地域の課題と特徴および地域に対する住民の見解を把握しました。

In the afternoon of the first day, a group of all the students and faculty members visited the study site together. Guided by the professor and lecturers of TU, the group carried out the site reconnaissance in three groups. The group also had an opportunity to visit a school and a community center to hear a story about the district and one successful community revitalization project organized in that community. The second day was the time for the group work on site. Each group assigned one or two communities conducted field work in that community area, and interviewed with the community leader to obtain local voices and to identify what to be improved and what to be harnessed in planning.













Sep 7

3日目にはケーススタディとして、タイランド・クリエイティブ・デザインセンター TCDC を訪れました。TCDC は2005年にショッピングセンター内にオープンし、2017年5月に、チャルンクルン通りに建つ築80年の中央郵便局の建物内に移転しています。TCDC および、チャオプラヤ川沿いの地域活性化に取り組む団体であるバンコク・リバー・パートナーのスタッフによる講義をうけ、館内の見学を行いました。講義では、多主体協働により新しい価値を生み出し、かつて活気あふれる商業地区であったチャルンクルン地区を創造界隈として活性化させていく進行中のプロジェクトについて知ることができました。

The group visited TCDC (Thailand Creative Design Center) as a case study visit on the third day, which has been locating in the Grand Postal Building of 80 years' old since May 2017. Lectures by representatives respectively from TCDC and Bangkok River Partners gave the group knowledge about a project aiming at regenerating the Charoenkrung district which used to be a lively commercial district as a creative district on the basis of co-creation development.

Group discussion started just after the case study visit on the third day by identifying positive points and negative points of the area, which were consolidated in a "community asset map". Towards presenting the group proposal consisting of a set of 25 idea cards and a poster containing the said cards, all the students worked hard together on discussion, making slides and posters, and brushing up the ideas. Although most groups faced with a difficulty in setting the direction and contents of the proposal partly because of a wide range of issues, and partly because of differences of the development stages, urban environment and culture among members' home countries, close communication gradually lead to mutual understanding and respect. Preparation for the presentation continued until night.

Sep.5-11 2017, Rangsit, Thammasat University

The main focus of the workshop is to consider community regeneration in the city facing the rapid urbanization, picking up Suan Yai Bang Khwang, Bang Kho Laem district in Bangkok as the study site. A total of 60 students from Japan, Malaysia, South Korea and Thailand were divided into 10 groups. Each group was assigned a specific theme; housing development, environmental development, commercial revitalization, disaster prevention, local economy development, community development scheme, and improvement of mobility and accessibility. Each group created a set of 25 idea cards as the result of the site visits and in-depth discussion to present a proposal to make the study site more attractive, livable and sustainable

Study Site

Bang Kho Laem

Bang Kho Laem district along the Chao Phraya River and Charoen Krung Road locates at the south of the center of Bangkok. It was used to be the fertile agricultural land with irrigation canals stretch from the Chao Phraya River, and from 19th century experienced it waterfront development accepting immigrants of different ethnic waterfront development accepting limitigrants of different ethnic groups. In the 1960s-1970s, the urban housing was increasingly spreading in the district, and nowadays the area is so densely populated. Since within Bang Kho Leam district, Suan Yal Bang Kho Leam district, Suan Yal Bang Khwang area has not experienced large-scale development so far, the original urban fabric including narrow alleys and canals still remains and the only one street is open to the car traffic although some parts of canals have become almost half the width of the original after having been cowered to provide more spaces to pedestrian and bike traffic. High-rise buildings also have not come in yet in spite of its high FAR of 700%. The resent largest change surrounding the area was the opening of Asiatique Riverfront in 2012 across the Charoen Krung Road. The big economy and the risk of high-rise waterfront development have been creeping up.




