


Breast Medical Oncology-Research

- The Style of Clinic
- →The patients are waiting in the room and the doctors go to the room.
 - The team: doctor, pharmacist, nurse practitioner and nurse.
- →They can take at least 30 minutes for one patients.



 Medical care is held by oncologist, surgeon and radiologist in Breast Cancer field.

About inpatients treatment

- →1 week rotation by doctors in BMO. (3~4 times in a year)
- →average 10 patients in the hospital
- →nurse practitioners are specialized in inpatients care and support doctors
