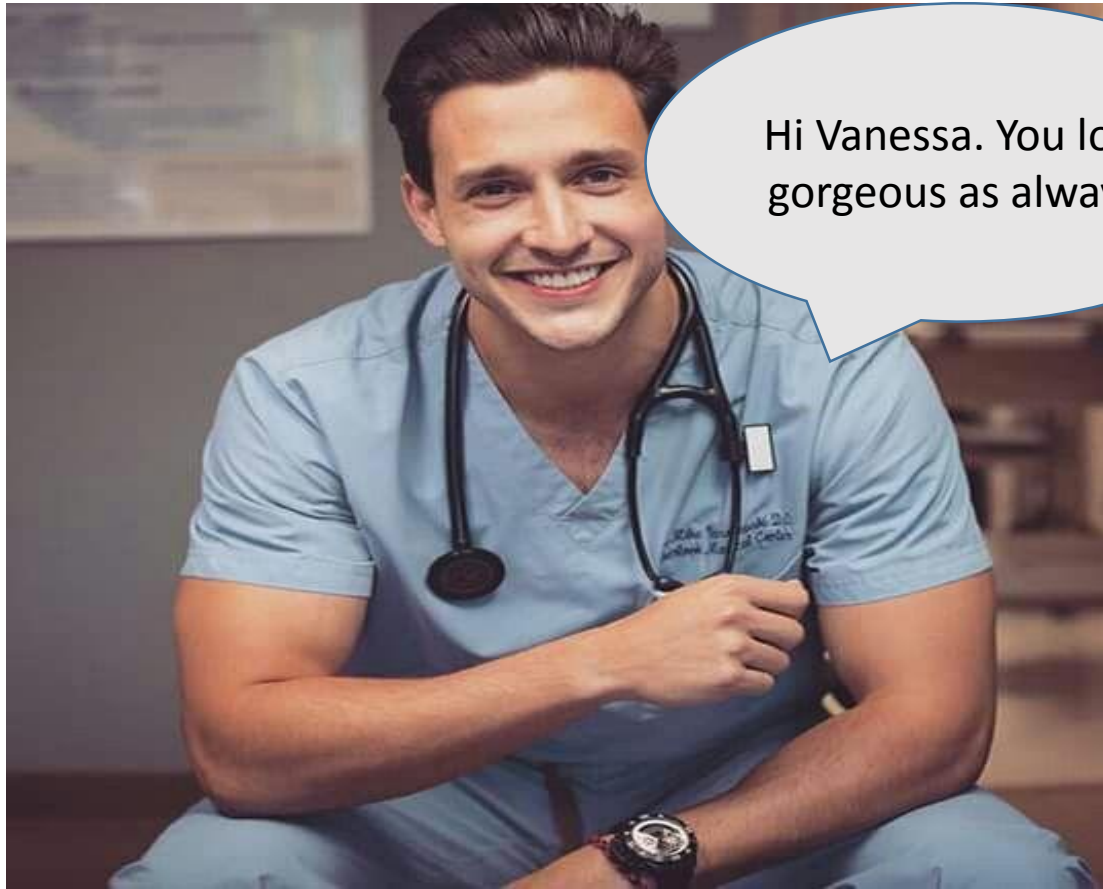

What is PA?

- A healthcare professional who practices medicine as a part of healthcare team with collaborating physicians and other providers
ex) Perform procedures, assist in surgery or autopsy, take medical history and make rounds in hospitals

In terms of specific skill level, PAs are BETTER than doctors
