
*Overview of Program

2nd-3rd basic medicine 4th-6th clinical rotation







⁺Our Daily Life in Paris

WHY choose France?

- Interested in breast surgery specialty
- Wanted to learn about oncology
- 60% of the doctors are women
 - Wanted to know the cultural attitudes toward working women, current situation
- Clinical and translational research







Oncology at Curie Institute

- Founded in 1909 by Marie Curie
- Private hospital and research center for cancer
 - 60% of the activity is for breast cancer.
 - Active in clinical trial
 (1 in 5 patients are on any trials!)







- Future Career Aspirations

Necker Hospital

- Oldest pediatric hospital in the world in 1778
 - →First stethoscope, in 1816 by René Laennec



What I did...

- **Epidural Births**
 - **80%** ⇔ 5% in Japan
 - Midwives have more responsibilities
- **Emergency** Obstetrics
- Postpartum care (ex. pelvic floor prevention)



Pros/Cons



Pros

- Living in PARIS for 1 month!
 - So many places to visit nearby, easy access
- Learning about France
 - Health system, history, culture, language

Cons

- Language Barrier
 - Communication mostly in French, with limited use of English
- Political Instability?
 - Protests, terrorist attacks, etc.

Advice for Next Year: Preparation (From June ~ Fall 2019)

What you can do starting TODAY...

- Step 1: <u>Do you have VALID English score?</u>
 - Study for TOEFL, IELTS
 : cannot use TOEFL score taken in 1st year
- Step 2: For Application Process
 - Curriculum Vitae (CV)
 - Your motives: why do you want to apply?
