- Students will increase their ability: to understand the main idea, recognize names and numbers, understand descriptions, understand key details, and effectively deal with the stress, intonation and rhythm of real-life English especially in academic settings.

- Students must take the TOEFL-ITP test scheduled by the university as the final exam for this class at the end of the semester.
- Students must take the PE Speaking Exam in one of their PE classes at the end of the semester. Failure to take this exam will result in a failing grade for PE.

 - C) Students must turn in an application with a score report attached showing a minimum score of 500 on ITP-TOEFL, or 600 on TOEIC, or pre 1 level on Eiken, or 500 on PBT-TOEFL, or 61 on iBT-TOEFL.
- 2. The following scores on the final exam are required in addition to the requirements in number 1 (A) and (B) above (regardless of outside test score) for the indicated grades¹:
