established under the foreign laws and regulations (hereinafter referred to as a "Foreign Corporation"), or a foreign government, a foreign governmental agency, a foreign local government, a foreign central bank, a foreign political party or any other

political organization (hereinafter referred to as a "Foreign Government") and is subject to the direction and order of the Foreign Corporation or the Foreign Government, or owes the duty of care of a good manager to the Foreign Corporation or the Foreign Government, according to the contract.

Examples:

- Holding posts concurrently at a Japanese and a foreign university (this includes cross-appointments)
- Working for a foreign company (not a foreign affiliated company)

Category(2)

A Person who earns or agrees to earn a large amount of money or other significant profit (money or other profit that accounts for 25% or more of the Person's annual income when converted into money) from a Foreign Government.

Examples:

- Receiving financial support for study abroad (a scholarship) from a foreign government
- Participating in a program of a foreign government for recruiting science and engineering human resources and personally receiving a large funding for research or living expenses.
